Patients meet MP

On 23 July an estimated 50 patients of the Barnard Medical Centre attended a meeting with James Brokenshire MP. He spoke of the challenges of reversing the down-grading of Queen Mary's Hospital as outlined in the so-called consultation' process "A Picture of Health" (APOH). He said that he had intervened person-ally with the Primary Care Trust to en-sure that the closure of the A&E and Maternity units is suspended, but he warned that APOH may be too far ad-vanced to be reversed and that the pro-posals had failed to provide anything in the way of a Plan B. QMH is under se-vere financial as well as operational stress. APOH is to be reconsidered by the Independent Reconfiguration Panel. The panel personnel will be differ-ent from those who had heard the original appeal to ensure an objective review.

Closures of QMH have been halted pending tests by the Independent Reconfigura-tion Panel. In addition, the Care Qual-ity Commission responsible for hospital standards was seeking a response from the Trust by the end of July. Although unlikely, the CQC may call for the clo-sure of units at QMH if service is con-sidered unsafe. People expressed the view that the original consultation did not take sympathetic note of travelling problems if QMH was closed, particu-larly to Senior citizens.

In conclusion, the assertion by many at the time of the publication of APOH, that QMH would pay dearly for the PFI experiment has turned out to be true. OMH must somehow be ex-tracted from the South London NHS Trust. Mr Brokenshire expressed his personal view that the future of QMH would be best served by a link with some of London's teaching hospitals.

Regarding the location of the Barnard Practice, Mr Brokenshire did not have any particular knowledge. He offered to get involved with efforts to deal with the PCT about continued use of the current building by the Barnard Practice.

There was a short discussion about the changes recently announced by Andrew Lansley. He clarified that GPs will be expected to work in groups to implement the new policies on commissioning. Dr Martin said that the Practice already has arrangements with a consortium of 6 other practices. On the question of other services at QMH, Mr Brokenshire said that it was his understanding that the Oxleas Trust would be providing some of these services.

The proposed Polyclinic has neither local community support nor adequatefinancing and is effectively 'dead in the water'. However the premises occupied by the Barnard Surgery are not large enough and additional space is required. Dr Martin explained that we were one of the few clinics that did not own its own premises. Mr Brokenshire expressed hope that the new policy, to transfer responsibility from PCTs to GPs, along with the possibility that Oxleas Trust may have a greater role to play, would help matters and he promised to work closely with the Clinic.
