CLINICS:

Antenatal Clinic

Tuesday and Thursday 14.00 - 17.40

Patients are seen by the midwife at the clinics by appointment and also by the doctors during surgery hours.

Baby Clinic

Monday 9.30 - 10.30

Wednesday & Friday 9.30 - 11.30

The baby clinics, run for child developmental checks and immunisations, allow an opportunity to discuss other problems, eg sleeping, feeding and child health worries, with a doctor or health visitor.

Asthma Clinic

This is run by the practice nurse in conjunction with the doctors, by appointment only.

Diabetic Clinic

This is run by the practice nurse in conjunction with the doctors, by appointment only.

Family Planning

Contraceptive care is provided by all the doctors during surgery hours.

Well Woman Clinics

This clinic is run by the nurses and health visitors for smears, postnatal checks and discussion for women's health issues.

Minor Surgery

The doctors carry out minor surgical procedures at the surgery by appointment and they will be happy to advise you on this.

Non-NHS Examinations

The doctors are happy to carry out medicals, eg insurance and driving licence, by appointment, outside surgery hours. Please telephone the surgery for an appointment. Please ask the reception for the charges for these services.

Swine flu and flu innoculations continue

The next Swine flu inoculations will be available on 16th January 2010 8am-12noon. The Health Centre are contacting patients by telephone and targeting the 6 months-65 years age group with chronic diseases, immune-compromised and pregnant women. This is a large list which they are working though as quickly as possible. These groups it will be followed by healthy children up to 5 years old. Patients in all these groups may book an appointment before they are contacted.

Seasonal Flu injections are still available and can be booked with the Practice Nurses.
